Spring Valley Update for March/April Newsleaf – 2024

Spring Valley's grounds and facilities remain open for winter hours through March and will transition to spring/summer hours on April 1. We continue to offer a full schedule of family, youth, and adult programs, as well as seasonal special events.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails are open for walkers every day from 8am-5pm through March. Starting April 1, hours will extend to sunset to accommodate our longer days.
- The gate leading onto Heritage Farm's walking paths from St. Matthew's Church will reopen daily on March 1.
- The **Nature Center Museum** is open to visitors daily from 10am-4pm. On April 1, these hours will be extended, with the facility open daily from 10am-6pm. The restrooms, drinking fountain and vending will be opened every day for visitor use.
- **Volkening Heritage Farm's Visitor Center** and other farm buildings will remain closed through the end of March but will then reopen Wednesday-Sunday from 10am-4pm starting April 3.
- **Bison's Bluff Nature Playground** will remain open daily from 10am-4:00pm during March, except during snowy, icy or rainy weather. Admission is free until the end of March. Starting April 1, the nature playground will be open daily from 10am-7pm, weather permitting, and the admission fees for children ages 2-12 will once again be in place. The restrooms near Bison's Bluff will reopen by April 1 as well.
- Volunteers continue to assist with outdoor conservation projects, trail maintenance, and with some of our events and programs. If you are enrolled as a Spring Valley volunteer and have questions about upcoming opportunities, please reach out to Volunteer Coordinator, Sarah Severson at saseverson@parkfun.com.

Heritage Farm Construction Alert!!

Construction on the new Heritage Farm Visitor Center expansion will begin this spring and is planned to wrap up by early 2025. During construction, programs will continue to take place in the historic farmhouse and other buildings as well as the Merkle Cabin in some cases. Cattle and pigs will be returning to the site again sometime in April or early May. Visitor information and the Museum Store will move into the adjacent farmhouse. Portable restrooms will be available on-site as well. All parking for Heritage Farm visitors during construction will be at St. Matthew Church.

NEW – Spring Valley App

There's now an app to use when you visit Spring Valley! The Spring Valley site use app is available free of charge for use on either Android or Apple smartphones. It features not only information on hours, site features, and facilities, but two guided tours that provide information on various natural history or historical topics as you walk the trails as well as information on each of the Heritage Farm buildings. The app is available from either the Google Play Store or Apple Store (simply type Spring Valley Nature Center into the search bar). It is also available as a web-app by going to www.springvalley.stqry.app.

Spring Events & Programs

Pre-registration is recommended for many events with limited attendance, although larger events are usually walk-in admission only. Nearly all classes have limited capacity and require pre-registration. More information and on-line registration are available via the Park District's virtual **Spring Program Guide**, found at www.parkfun.com. Youth Summer Camp information is available on the website as well!

Sugar Bush Fair's popular pancake breakfast and outdoor maple syruping demonstrations will return on Saturday & Sunday, March 16 & 17, 9am-noon! Reservations for the breakfast is recommended and can be made by visiting www.parkfun.com. Breakfast reservations are \$7/plate if purchased prior to 12:00pm on March 15. Day-of tickets are \$8/plate and will be available until 11:30am each day.

Sunset Fire & Picnic on the Prairie will also return (weather permitting) on Saturday, April 6, 5-7pm. Reservations are recommended for this popular evening program exploring the benefits of fire for our Midwestern natural areas. The registration cost is \$4/resident or \$5/non-resident, with children 2 and under free. Reservations are available at www.parkfun.com.

Earth Day Party is scheduled for Sunday, April 21, 12-4pm. A variety of family-friendly green living and environmental awareness activities and demonstrations will be available in both the Nature Center's backyard and at Heritage Farm, including a display of live hawks and owls, and some with take home crafts or plantings. A wagon shuttle will transport visitors between Heritage Farm and the Nature Center. Parking will be available at either the Nature Center or St. Matthew's Church. Admission is paid at the event and is \$3/person or \$12/family.

Eggsapalooza, which takes place Saturday, April 6, combines a scavenger hunt on the trails with an egg hunt near Merkle Cabin, followed by a wagon ride. This popular family program usually sells out, so pre-register early for one of twelve morning or afternoon sessions, starting at 9:00am and repeating every half-hour. Registration fee is \$5/resident or \$6/non-resident.

Walpurgis Night returns on Friday, April 26, 6-8pm, but at a new location this year – Merkle Cabin! This traditional German holiday features witches in April, marshmallows around a campfire, a craft activity, and a wagon ride. Pre-registration is advised, and the fee is \$7/resident or \$8/non-resident.

1974 And Beyond

Spring Valley began as a dream by one of the founders of the Village of Schaumburg, Ellsworth Meineke. Early on he referred to it as “The Spring Valley Dream.” It was he who convinced the Schaumburg Park District and the Village of Schaumburg to work together to acquire and preserve land for Spring Valley. Ellsworth founded the Spring Valley Nature Club in 1974 as a not-for-profit service organization which provides volunteer and financial support for Spring Valley and promotes conservation, nature, and environmental education. The Club sponsors nature programs and teacher field trips, and members volunteer at festivals and fund raisers. We have been working hard since 1974. Won’t you join us?

These words reflect the dedication that the founders felt for the purpose of the Club and the love of the natural world around us. Since the Schaumburg Park District assumed the responsibility of recruiting volunteers, Nature Club’s purpose has evolved to share its love of Spring Valley by offering timely programs that reinforce a more wholesome lifestyle. We have initiated monthly educational programs that instill a comprehension of our ability to lessen our carbon footprint by reducing waste, recycling and reusing our valuable resources. Our monthly programs enlighten us to appreciate our environment and respect its fragile beauty.

We have lessened our impact on landfill waste by eliminating the mailing of our bimonthly News Leaf. We are encouraging members to attend educational programs which teach us the importance of the wildlife around us, the art of using our natural resources wisely and being more self-reliant by advising how to live a more wholesome lifestyle, grow and live more organically and become more self-sufficient.

With the kind donations and assistance from local merchants and organizations, we can exist more ecologically by shopping locally.
