Spring Valley Update for January/February 2026

Spring Valley's grounds and facilities will remain on 'winter' hours until April 1. The Nature Center continues to offer a full schedule of family, youth, and adult programs and unique events.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails are open every day from 8am-5pm.
- The Nature Center Museum is open to visitors daily from 10am-4pm.
- Volkening Heritage Farm's Visitor Center and other farm buildings are closed during the winter months. The Farm does offer limited programs during winter. Visit www.parkfun.com for more information on winter programs offered.
- Bison's Bluff Nature Playground will remain open daily from 10am-4:00pm at no charge through the end of March when safe conditions exist (no snow, ice, rain, or temperatures below 32°F).
- The Merkle Cabin is available for private events when not scheduled for programs. Requests for rentals need to be submitted at least two weeks in advance. Rates are based on residency.
- Volunteers continue to assist with outdoor conservation projects, garden and trail maintenance, youth summer camps, and with our events and programs. If you are willing and able to assist with projects, please contact Jeff Pal at jepal@parkfun.com.

Snowshoe Rentals

Snowshoe rentals will once again be offered anytime there is 4 inches or more of snow on the ground. Rentals are available between the hours of 10:00am and 3:00pm. The cost is \$5/pair for one hour of use. Call the Nature Center for more information on snow conditions.

Spring Valley App

Staff maintains a site-use app for use on either Android or Apple smartphones. It features not only information on hours, site features, and facilities, but two guided tours that provide information on various natural history or historical topics as you walk the trails. The app is FREE and available from either the Google Play Store or Apple Store (simply type Spring Valley Nature Center into the search bar). It is also available as a web-app by going to www.springvalley.stgry.app.

Nature Center Construction Alert

The construction that was anticipated to begin in November of 2025 has been delayed till September of 2026. This work would affect the façade and offices at the Nature Center. Once begun, this will result in periodic closures of the Nature Center, except for program functions. This will last into the first half of 2027. More information on this project will be forthcoming.

Breakfast is served under a large, enclosed tent on the grounds of Merkle Cabin, a short walk from the Nature Center. Breakfast includes pancakes, sausage, beverages, and real maple syrup. Event attendance is free. Reservations for the pancake breakfast are \$8.00/person if made by noon on March 13. Day-of breakfast admission will be \$10/person. Ellsworth founded the Spring Valley Nature Club in 1974 as a not-for-profit service organization which provides volunteer and financial support for Spring Valley and promotes conservation, nature, and environmental education.
