## Spring Valley Update for March/April Newsleaf – 2025

Spring Valley's grounds and facilities remain open for winter hours through March and will transition to spring/summer hours on April 1. We continue to offer a full schedule of family, youth, and adult programs, as well as seasonal special events.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails are open for walkers every day from 8am-5pm through March. Starting April 1, hours will extend to sunset to accommodate our longer days.
- Parking for Heritage Farm will continue to be at St. Matthew's Church, with access via the gate located at the south end of the parking area.
- The **Nature Center Museum** is open to visitors daily from 10am-4pm. On April 1, these hours will be extended, with the facility open daily from 10am-6pm. The restrooms, drinking fountain and vending will be opened every day for visitor use.
- Volkening Heritage Farm's farm buildings will remain closed through the end of March but will then reopen Wednesday-Sunday from 10am-4pm starting April 1.
- **Bison's Bluff Nature Playground** will remain open daily from 10am-4:00pm during March, except during snowy, icy or rainy weather. Admission is free until the end of March. Starting April 1, the nature playground will be open daily from 10am-7pm, weather permitting, and the admission fees for children ages 2-12 will once again be in place. The restrooms near Bison's Bluff will reopen by April 1 as well.
- Volunteers continue to assist with outdoor conservation projects, trail maintenance, and with some of our events and programs. If you are enrolled as a Spring Valley volunteer and have questions about upcoming opportunities, please reach out to Volunteer Coordinator, Jeff Pal at jepal@parkfun.com.

#### Heritage Farm Construction Update

Construction on the new Heritage Farm Visitor Center expansion is expected to wrap up sometime this spring. During construction, programs will continue to take place in the historic farmhouse and other buildings as well as the Merkle Cabin in some cases. Cattle and pigs will be returning to the site again sometime in April. Visitor information and the Museum Store will continue to operate out of the farmhouse. Portable restrooms are available on-site as well. All parking for Heritage Farm visitors during construction is at St. Matthew Church.

#### Spring Valley App

There's now an app to use when you visit Spring Valley! The Spring Valley site use app is available free of charge for use on either Android or Apple smartphones. It features not only information on hours, site features, and facilities, but two guided tours that provide information on various natural history or historical topics as you walk the trails as well as information on each of the Heritage Farm buildings. The app is available from either the Google Play Store or Apple Store (simply type Spring Valley Nature Center into the search bar). It is also available as a web-app by going to <a href="https://www.springvalley.stqry.app">www.springvalley.stqry.app</a>.

#### Spring Events & Programs

Pre-registration is recommended for many events with limited attendance, although larger events are usually walk-in admission only. Nearly all classes have limited capacity and require pre-registration. More information and on-line registration are available via the Park District's virtual **Spring Program Guide**, found at <u>www.parkfun.com</u>. Youth Summer Camp information is available on the website as well!

**Sugar Bush Fair's** popular pancake breakfast and outdoor maple syruping demonstrations returns on Saturday & Sunday, March 15 & 16, 9am-noon! Reservations for the breakfast is recommended and can be made by visiting <u>www.parkfun.com</u>. Breakfast reservations are \$7.50/plate if purchased prior to 12:00pm on March 14. Day-of tickets are \$9/plate and will be available until 11:30am each day.

### Spring Valley Update for March/April Newsleaf – 2025 cont.

**Eggsapalooza**, which takes place Sunday, April 13, combines a scavenger hunt on the trails with an egg hunt near Merkle Cabin, followed by a wagon ride. This very popular family program sells out, so pre-register early for one of twelve morning or afternoon sessions, starting at 9:00am and repeating every half-hour. Registration fee is \$6/resident or \$8/non-resident.

**Earth Day Party** is scheduled for Sunday, April 27, 12-4pm. A variety of family-friendly green living and environmental awareness activities and demonstrations will be available in both the Nature Center's backyard and at Heritage Farm, including a display of live hawks and owls, and some with take home crafts or plantings. A wagon shuttle will transport visitors between Heritage Farm and the Nature Center. Parking will be available at either the Nature Center or St. Matthew's Church. Admission is paid at the event and is \$3/person or \$12/family.

**Walpurgis Night** returns on Saturday, May 3, 6-8pm, at Merkle Cabin! This traditional German holiday features witches in April, marshmallows around a campfire, a craft activity, and a wagon ride. Pre-registration is advised, and the fee is \$7/resident or \$8/non-resident.

#### Native Plant & Heirloom Vegetable Sale – Saturday & Sunday, May 17 & 18, 9am-4pm

Pre-order your native wildflowers, grasses, shrubs or heirloom vegetables and herbs for this year's garden projects!
