Spring Valley Update for March/April 2026

Spring Valley's grounds and facilities will remain open for winter hours through March and will transition to spring/summer hours on April 1. We continue to offer a full schedule of family, youth, and adult programs and unique events.

- Spring Valley's grounds and walking trails are open every day from 8am-5pm. Starting April 1, hours will extend to 8pm to accommodate our longer days.
- The Nature Center Museum is open to visitors daily from 10am-4pm.
- Volkening Heritage Farm's Visitor Center and other farm buildings will remain closed through the end of March but will then reopen Wednesday-Sunday from 10am-4pm starting April 1.
- Bison's Bluff Nature Playground will remain open daily from 10am-4:00pm at no charge through the end of March when safe conditions exist (no snow, ice, rain, or temperatures below 32°F). Admission is free until the end of March. Starting April 1, the nature playground will be open daily from 10am-7pm, weather permitting, and the admission fees for children aged 2-12 will once again be in place. The restrooms near Bison's Bluff will reopen by April 1 as well.
- Volunteers continue to assist with outdoor conservation projects, garden and trail maintenance, youth summer camps, and with our events and programs. If you are willing and able to assist with projects, please contact Jeff Pal at jepal@parkfun.com.

Spring Valley App

Staff maintain a site-use app for use on either Android or Apple smartphones. It features not only information on hours, site features, and facilities, but two guided tours that provide information on various natural history or historical topics as you walk the trails. The app is FREE and available from either the Google Play Store or Apple Store (simply type Spring Valley Nature Center into the search bar). It is also available as a web-app by going to www.springvalley.stqry.app.

Nature Center Construction Alert

The construction that was anticipated to begin in November of 2025 has been delayed till September of 2026. This work would affect the façade and offices at the Nature Center. Once begun, this will result in periodic closures of the Nature Center, except for program functions. This will last into the first half of 2027. More information on this project will be forthcoming.

Sugar Bush Fair – Saturday & Sunday, March 14 & 15, 9:00am-12:00pm

Celebrate spring's arrival with us! Learn about the history of maple syruping at our demonstration areas and enjoy a delicious pancake breakfast. Breakfast is served under a large, enclosed tent on the grounds of Merkle Cabin, a short walk from the Nature Center. Breakfast includes pancakes, sausage, beverages, and real maple syrup. Event attendance is free. Reservations for the pancake breakfast are \$8.00/person if made by noon on March 13. Day-of breakfast admission will be \$10/person. Eggsapalooza – Sunday, March 29

Celebrate spring's arrival with a family scavenger hunt starting at Heritage Farm and ending at Merkle Cabin, where a special egg hunt will be set up in the woods. The return to Heritage Farm will be via a tractor-drawn wagon ride. This very popular family program sells out, so pre-register early for one of ten morning or afternoon sessions, starting at 9:00am and repeating every half-hour. Registration is \$7/resident or \$9/non-resident.

Earth Day Party – Sunday, April 19, 12:00pm-4:00pm

A variety of family-friendly green living and environmental awareness activities and demonstrations will be available in both the Nature Center's backyard and at Heritage Farm, including a display of live hawks and owls, and some with take home crafts or plantings. A wagon shuttle will transport visitors between Heritage Farm and the Nature Center. Parking will be available at either the Nature Center or St. Matthew's Church. Admission is paid at the event and is \$3/person or \$12/family.

Native Plant & Heirloom Vegetable Sale – Saturday & Sunday, May 16 & 17, 9am-4pm

Pre-order your native wildflowers, grasses, shrubs or heirloom vegetables and herbs for this year's garden projects! The Schaumburg Community Garden Club offers pre-orders on the native plants again this year. The above dates are when orders can be picked up at Spring Valley.
